

Based on Vertovs approach, it acknowledged the impact of the filmmaking process upon the recording of actuality, and more readily recognised the subjectivity of the filmmaker in securing filmic evidence of what took place. Rouch essentially suggests that the documentary form must be defined through the integrity and purpose of its author. The value and purpose of actuality footage in regard to its delineation of documentary truth is therefore in direct relationship to the intention of those who produce it. The term is sometimes confused with a US kind of filmmaking which is actually closer to direct cinema.
